GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Rules available at www.westernhorse.co.za/rulebooks
2. Open to all Breeds and sizes of horses/ponies.
3. The organizers reserve the right to scratch, combine and restrict classes should they deem it necessary.
4. If a class is cancelled due to lightning or other weather it will not be rescheduled.
5. All horses must have documentation of an Influenza vaccination within 6 months of the date of the show and of African Horse Sickness vaccination within 12 months of the date of the show.
6. The age of all horses and riders, where applicable, will be calculated from the actual date of birth to the day of the show.
7. No cross entries of horses are allowed between Division Groups. A youth and adult rider may ride the same horse in the same division for two different age groups.
8. Riders under 19 ARE NOT PERMITTED to ride stallions.
9. Hard Hats for Youth and short stirrup classes are MANDATORY.
10. EXERCISING OF HORSES: NO exercising of horses is allowed in the main arena.
11. SHOW NUMBERS: Numbers will be allocated per Horse.
12. Horses and riders/handlers who are not in the arena within 2 minutes after the class is called will not be allowed to compete in that class.
13. To receive ranking points, you must be a member of the SAEF (www.saeef.org.za), but you are also welcome to take part as a day member. Day memberships points does not count towards ranking points.

Class	Description
Western Dressage Youth & Adult All Divisions	This competition combines the Western traditions of horse and rider with Classical Dressage. The horse must complete a test where the horse and rider will be judged on neatness, maneuverability and obedience.
Western Horsemanship Youth & Adult All Divisions	Is a competition where the capabilities of the rider are judged. There are two parts to the class, the first part the rider must complete an individual course that has been given to them before the class and the second phase where the riders must compete together to show the walk, jog and lope. The judge pays attention to the seat of the rider, their confidence and the manner in which they communicate with their horse.
Western Pleasure Youth & Adult All Divisions	The riders all compete together in the ring; they must demonstrate a walk, jog and lope to the left and to the right. At the end of the class the riders are asked to rein back. The calm manner of the horse and quick reaction to the aids given by the rider during transitions are judged. Penalty points are given for riding too fast and for the wrong gait or lead
Western Trail Youth & Adult All Divisions	This class is similar to the working riding class, though the obstacles are similar to those you would find out on the trail. There are 3 mandatory obstacles, opening closing a gate, a backing obstacle and walking, jogging and/or loping over a pole or series of poles. The horse is judged on the willingness to follow the riders' cues and maneuver through the obstacles smoothly. The horse will be penalized for refusing, hitting poles, misbehavior etc.
Ranch Pleasure Horse Youth & Adult All Divisions	The purpose of Ranch Horse Pleasure horse should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded and horse does not have to be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements, and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations.
Reining Patterns 1 & 2 Youth & Adult All Divisions	This competition calls for the rider to demonstrate complete control of horses every movement. The horse must complete a prescribed pattern and the horse will be judged on neatness, maneuverability and obedience. Penalties are given for incorrect leads, breaking gait, resisting the riders' cues etc. The rider will be disqualified if they fail to follow the correct pattern.
Western Riding Youth & Adult Open Division	This competition is ridden individually and aims to show control over a horse's paces and lead changes in a set pattern that usually takes horse and rider over a small log and navigates around sets of cones in loops and serpentine, usually ending in a stop and a back up. The pattern is scored on precision, evenness of gait quietness of the horse and rider and lead changes.
